"Perkins says it perfectly: 'Only the power of Christ's crucifixion on the cross and the glory of His resurrection can heal the deep racial wounds in both black and white people in America.' He was comforted by the biblical promise that God hears the cries of the innocent and loves the oppressed (Psalm 34:17-18; Luke 4:18-19).

Perkins realized that in the same way that his brother Clyde had been wrongly murdered, Christ had been as well. Perkins realized that Jesus too had faced a lynch mob and died on a tree, not unlike too many men in the state of Mississippi. Perkins realized that Jesus had not only forgiven his attackers, but prayed for them and loved them as well. This is the power of Christianity and the compelling nature of Perkins' story: in the face of hurt and persecution, like Jesus on the cross, we can say, 'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.'
