PSALM 91:1-16 (TNIV) ¹ WHOEVER DWELLS in the shelter of OTHE MOST HIGH will rest in the shadow of OTHE ALMIGHTY.

² THEY SAY OF OTHE LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress,

GMY GOD, in whom I trust."

³ <u>SURELY</u> he will save you from the fowler's snare and from the deadly pestilence.
⁴ He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart.
⁵ You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day,
⁶ nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday.

I found that when a passage of Scripture has been very familiar to me for a long time – such as this passage! – if I will simply **slow down** . . . take my time . . . and read thoughtfully and reflectively, it can become alive to me in new and fresh ways.

Yesterday we looked at the challenges the Psalmist faced in his day...but also **found comfort in the character and identity of God,** as revealed in four of his **names:** MOST HIGH GOD — ALMIGHTY GOD — LORD — "OUR GOD".

Today we find encouragement and hope in seven of his *actions,* as revealed in the actions verbs and metaphors that the Psalmist applies to God:

- The *Shelter* we dwell in
- The *Shadow* we rest in
- My *Refuge* to hide in
- My Fortress to find protection in
- The mother hen whose *Feathers* will cover us...
- and whose *Wings* we will find refuge under;
- The one whose *Faithfulness* will be our *Shield* and *Rampart*

In a word, we are "covered"!

We also recognize that **our choices** seem to invoke God's protective care. We seem to have a power of self-determination that **invites** God's engagement in our lives. It's called "free will." Just look at the active choices that the Psalmist engages in . . .

SO, WE CAN ASK OURSELVES IF WE ARE MAKING LIFE-GIVING CHOICES...

• Are we actively **dwelling** in the shelter of the Most High? (v. 1a)

• Do we actually **say** of the Lord, "He is *my refuge* and *my fortress, my God,* in whom I <u>trust</u>"? (v. 2)

- Do we honestly **say**, "The Lord is my refuge"? (v. 9a)
- Are we **making** the Most High our "dwelling"? (v. 9b)
- Do we **love** the Lord with everything we've got? (v. 14a)
- Are we "**acknowledging**" His name? Do we cultivate a personal relationship... to the point where we honestly "**know**" who He is? (v. 14b)
- And finally: Do we **call** on Him when troubles come our way? (v. 15)

So again today, MOST HIGH GOD — ALMIGHTY GOD — LORD — "OUR GOD" we turn to you.

We want to make our selves "at home" in the shelter you provide for us. We want to learn to fully "be still" and "rest" in your calming presence. We want to get to know you better today... and love you with all of our resources and capacities!
