

INDOOR SERVICE FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

(March 18, 2021)

Q: Where do I go when I arrive?

A: We have two entrances to our Sanctuary: one from the South parking lot, and one from the North parking lot.

At both entrances, you'll come to a sign that reads "Temperature Check." A friendly helper will take a quick touchless temperature scan of your forehead and will direct you to the check-in station. At the check-in station, you'll find:

- a Bulletin (with Worship Songs, Message Outline, Connection Card and Offering Envelope)
- a complimentary face mask (in case you forgot yours!)
- Hand Sanitizer (to keep us all healthy and strong!)
- an Offering Box for your tithes and offerings

Q: What programs are offered for families?

A: CHILDREN (3-5 years) — our wonderful Miss Emily will be leading a children's program in the nursery/preschool playground.

CHILDREN (Kindergarten-5th grade) — our fantastic Children's Pastor, Mrs. Sandy will be leading a children's program indoors in Moller Chapel.

FAMILY FOCUS will be meeting in Anderson Hall after the 9:00 service.

MARRIED STRONG will be meeting indoors after the 9:00 service (with Children's Ministry for children 3-5 years). *Contact group for location.*

Q: Will restrooms be available?

A: Yes! Restrooms are available in the Lobby of the Sanctuary.

Q: Will the Connection Café be open?

A: No, not yet. But we look forward to opening the café as opportunity permits.

Q: Will we continue to live-stream our worship service every week?

A: Yes. We will continue live-streaming our worship service indefinitely because we have members and regular attenders who are not yet able to participate in person due to health precautions, and because over the past 12 months we have connected with guests who've become part of the Bethany Family by watching online!

Q: Is there anything else I need to be aware of?

A: Yes.

- (1) Please wear your mask at all times. Our pastors and worship leader may not when they are on stage...so their speaking or singing will be intelligible.
- (2) It isn't what we are used to, but we encourage you to avoid hugs and handshakes. We're showing our love for one another by "*refraining from embracing*" (Eccl. 3:5)!
- (3) Please be patient with us! We need your prayers for wisdom as we continue in this season of almost constant change in health protocols.
