Ephesians 3 (TNIV)

¹ For this reason I, Paul, **THE PRISONER OF CHRIST JESUS** for the sake of you Gentiles—

² Surely you have heard about the administration of **God's grace** that was given to me for you, ³ that is, the mystery made known to me by revelation, as I have already written briefly. ⁴ In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵ which was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. ⁶ This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus.

⁷ I became A SERVANT OF THIS GOSPEL by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am LESS THAN THE LEAST OF ALL THE LORD'S PEOPLE, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things.

¹⁰ His intent was that now, **THROUGH THE CHURCH**, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹ according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹² In him and through faith in him we may APPROACH GOD with freedom and confidence. ¹³ I ask you, therefore, not to be discouraged because of my sufferings for you, which are your glory.

"Th	a word for 'manifold' (nolunoz	kilos) means (many-coloured) and wa	as used to describe flow-	

"The word for 'manifold' (polupozkilos) means 'many-coloured', and was used to describe flowers, crowns, embroidered cloth and woven carpets. The simpler word pozkilos was used in the LXX of the 'coat of many colours' (AV) or 'richly ornamented robe' (NIV) which Jacob gave to his youngest son Joseph (Gn. 37:3,23,32). The church as a multi-racial, multi-cultural community is like a beautiful tapestry. Its members come from a wide range of colourful backgrounds. No other human community resembles it. Its diversity and harmony are unique. It is God's new society. And the many-coloured fellowship of the church is a reflection of the many-coloured (or 'many-splendoured', to use Francis Thompson's word) wisdom of God."
